Language requirements for French and English	<p>The exchange program guidelines establish that student must have sufficient knowledge of the French language. To attest the level in French and/or English, student must provide either an official test, a certificate from a language instructor stating the CECR Level equivalence.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ For exchange students, a B1 level is recommended in French and in English depending if they choose courses in English or in French). ▪ For double-degree students, a B1 level is recommended in French and in English but a B2 level will be necessary to obtain the engineering degree.
French grading system	Grenoble INP – UGA uses the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) . One academic year corresponds to 60 ECTS, one semester to 30 ECTS. Exchange

	students take a maximum of 30 ECTS per semester or 60 ECTS per year.	
Academic Calendar	The start and end dates of classes are different from one school to another and depend on the level at which student enter the school. Please refer to the host school to know exactly when the semester is beginning and ending.

Application	Incoming students have to complete an online application form (there is no need to send documents by e-mail or mail). The link will be sent directly by e-mail to the nominated students (with copy to our partners) from the beginning of March. Accommodation	<p>In Grenoble: ISSO has accommodation service which provides rooms to students on the different campuses. Student visa requirements	<p>https://international.univ-grenoble-alpes.fr/getting-organized/visas-and-residence-permits/</p> <p>Students, except European ones (EU-EEA), have to apply for a student visa at the French Embassy of their country of residence. It is highly recommended to start this procedure very early.</p> <p>Some Students have to apply to the CEF on-line procedure as well (65 countries are concerned): https://www.campusfrance.org/en/procedure-studying-in-France</p>
Health insurance	In France, the healthcare system generally takes care of most healthcare costs. Subscription to health insurance is mandatory (upon they arrival) for stays of more than 3 months, unless there is a bilateral agreement between France and your country of origin. This is the case for all member states of the European Union, European Economic Area, as well as Switzerland and Quebec: steps are thus to be taken before their arrival in France.
